



















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Impact of Covid-19 pandemic on mental health

What we learned

Financial impact of Covid-19

Under two in ten Ottawa residents say the pandemic has **increased** or somewhat increased the **risk of homelessness** for those they care about.

Residents of Ottawa are **over two times more likely** to report a **negative** rather than
a positive **impact** of the pandemic on their **personal finances**. Loss of
income/employment is reported by one out
of two negatively impacted residents of
Ottawa.
