

## ADDRESS THE EROSION OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACROSS ONTARIO BY:

Reintroducing rent controls to **buildings erected after November** 2018

Fully implement Bill 97 to amend the Residential Tenancies Act and prohibit bad faith renovictions

## IMPLEMENT THE AMO'S RECOMMENDATIONS TO END CHRONIC HOMELESSNESS

IN 2025, THE ASSOCIATION OF MUNICIPALITIES OF ONTARIO RELEASED A REPORT CALLING FOR:

An Investment of \$11-billion over 10 years to create more than 75,000 new affordable and supportive housing units.

This approach would prevent people from becoming chronically homeless by creating stable exits from homelessness.

An investment of \$2 billion over eight years to tackle the immediate priority of ensuring all people living in encampments are safely and appropriately housed by greatly increasing the capacity of support services and supportive, transitional and community housing.

These proposed investments would be in addition to current levels of spending.

## ADDRESS INADEQUATE INCOMES FOR VULNERABLE ONTARIANS BY:

**Significantly increasing** social assistance rates to enable vulnerable **Ontarians to live with** dignity and security.

Increasing the provincial minimum wage to enable minimum wage earners to meet their expenses without having to work multiple positions.

**Reviewing the UNESCO findings** concerning the 2017 - 2019 Ontario basic income program.

The findings showed positive impacts for the mental and physical health as well as the employment prospects of participants, with a view to reestablishing this program.
